



Indian PM's '3 Day, 3 Nation' Europe Visit

02 May – 16 May 2022

Prime Minister Narendra Modi concluded his three European Nation visits which strengthen the spirit of cooperation with Germany, Denmark and France. During his visit, he held series of bi-lateral meetings to boost ties in a range of areas including green and renewable energy, climate action, cooperation in trade and investments, innovations and skill development.
